INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS OF PAPERS

1. Short presentation of the IRDO conference history:

The IRDO conference named SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY AND CURRENT CHALLENGES has since 2006 created the tradition of making a rich survey of the behaviour and development concerning the social responsibility (SR). European Union defines SR as one's responsibility for one's impacts on society. The IRDO conference exposes a selected topic pressing in the given period of time.

The world top political bodies and local communities understand more and more that the visible problems concerning the nature and humans, including economy, around the world are not problems of nature, but of people and related SR.

Topics covered so far include: Social responsibility in general (2006), Managers' Role in the development of Social Responsibility in for-profit and not-for-profit organizations (2007), Social responsibility as contribution to stakeholders' long term success in market (2008), Work – a bridge to cooperation: relations with co-workers and different age generations (2009), Social responsibility: nature and humans (2010), Youth in focus of world changes (2011). In 2012 IRDO conference focused on Innovation of culture toward more social responsibility - the way out of socio-cultural crisis. In 2013 Maribor is 'The European capital of youth' and the 8th IRDO conference is making a contribution to it with the above title and topic.

2. Why to research and present papers on topics of SR education and communication?

In October 2011, European Union published its action plan for promotion of social responsibility (SR) and urged governments of EU member states and big enterprises to promote social responsibility and be its role models along with all other organizations with public influence; this includes business, governments, non-profit organizations, individuals, schools of all levels, and **youngsters of all ages**.

EU calls for application of, among others, ISO 26000 standard on social responsibility in each organization. Its <u>7 core subjects</u> include **organizational governance**, human rights, labour practices, the environment, fair operating practices, consumer issues, and community involvement and development. The crucial novelties linking them are <u>interdependence</u> and <u>holistic approach</u>.

The timing of both documents' publication says that SR is supposed to **help humankind find its way out from the current socio-cultural crisis: as the new culture.** But for this aim we, first, need to get the right information at the right time to behave socially responsibly. We need to understand the concept of social responsibility and to communicate it to others. Then our awareness about social responsibility benefits will rise, we'll be more responsible and our culture will change toward a more responsible society.

Enterprise 2020 is an ambitious initiative launched by CSR Europe in 2010 to address the European and global challenges which are increasingly bringing into question our current patterns

of living, working, learning, communicating, consuming and sharing resources. IRDO Institute is a National partner organization (from Slovenia) of CSR Europe. In the context of the EU's Europe 2020 strategy, Enterprise 2020 highlights the contribution that businesses can make to achieve the EU goals for building a smart, sustainable and inclusive economy delivering high levels of employment, productivity and social cohesion by 2020. Since its launch, Enterprise 2020 has become the European movement for companies committed to developing innovative business practices and working together with their stakeholders to provide solutions to emerging societal needs.

ISO26000:2010 addresses criteria of socially responsible behaviour by its <u>7 principles:</u> 1. accountability, 2. transparency, 3. ethical behaviour, 4. respect for stakeholder interests, 5. respect for the rule of law, 6. respect for international norms of behaviour, and 7. respect for human rights. Many humans, especially youngsters are educated in this culture, but not all.

Values reflect and influence human attitudes and habits, either for the dangerous irresponsibility of so far or for the necessary social responsibility of humans as individuals and their organizations all way from family, friends, enterprises, communities, countries, to the entire humankind. The current alternative is clear: either we perish in the next (world) war, or SR becomes the prevailing values & culture – attitude and habit, ethics and norm of our behaviour. But this includes also all of us (of any age) willing to update our knowledge, communication, values and habits.

2. The IRDO 2013 Conference is aimed at:

- Sharing professional views, opinions, and experiences from theory and practice, concerning values, culture, ethics and norms (VCEN), expressed as social responsibility (SR) via education of youngsters (or whatever age) and communication;
- Pointing out strengths and weaknesses of the current practice of promotion and implementation of SR among different stakeholders (employees, teachers, media, business, government, NGO's, etc.);
- Promoting good practices to show what are the possibilities and results of SR in Slovenia, EU and elsewhere;
- Contributing professional contents for drafting the National strategy of development of social responsibility;
- Reformulations of contemporary socioeconomic measures supportive of SR of youngsters (of whatever age);
- Informing the broader society about the advances in practice of SR.

Every day the morning program is aimed at several **invited international experts with rich experiences**, related workshops and discussions. Their presentations are followed by open-space style presentations of abstracts of all afternoon speakers. **The afternoon program** is open for everybody submitting theoretical and/or practical contributions accepted in a double blind review process by the conference board. The third day interesting performances of youngsters (of whatever age) in Slovenia and abroad will be presented.

3. Suggested topics for contributions:

A. Education models, programmes and projects concerning social responsibility:

Development of social responsibility programmes, projects, including the 7 principles in all 7 areas of ISO 26000 cited above, and development for humans' and their organizations' holistic approach and ethics of interdependence as a/the prevailing values/culture/ethics/norms/habits. Implementation of social responsibility as an invention-innovation-diffusion process in education practice:

A1: in schools of all levels - from kindergarten to doctoral programs

A2: in business theory and practice

A3: in non-governmental organizations

A4: in governmental and public institutions

B. Communication of SR:

National and branch awareness-raising campaigns, various communication models, tools, messages, channels, measurements, etc.:

B1: In media

- B2: in schools from kindergarten to doctoral programs
- B3: In business theory and practice
- B4: in non-governmental organizations

B5: in public institutions

B6: In government

C. Development of individual, organizational and societal SR policies:

C1: Culture of social responsibility in media and other sources of indirect education

- C2: Government strategies for development of social responsibility
- C3: Legislation and public policies

C4: Creation of public dialog on SR topics

C5: Codes of conduct as teachers', parents', experts', managers' and others' culture supportive of social responsibility

C6: The best practices promoting SR (projects, awards, etc.) and their impact over social responsibility of individuals and organizations

D. Youth and creativity, SR strategies, projects:

D1: Youth worker as a new profession promoting social responsibility

D2: Critical literacy of young people (how to look critically at the media info, the impact of media on youth, etc.)

D3: Creative actions, ads, campaigns, protests for more SR

E. Other: Your suggestions for topics are welcome!

4. Content, size, and language of your contributions:

Contributions should tackle **any of the topics** suggested above from viewpoints of theory and/or practical solutions concerning development of social responsibility focusing on finding ways out from the current crisis and backing in Slovenia and elsewhere... Especially welcome are concrete strategies, tactics, and proposals. Theoretical contributions should be backed by practical experiences and present the latter too, where existing. Paper abstracts should be up to 250 words long and in English and include up to 5 key words. E-mail them to sabina.kojc@irdo.si by <u>30 November 2012.</u>

Detailed instructions for formatting of papers and other conference information will be sent to authors of accepted abstracts. Contributions should be **up to 4.000 words** long, in Times New Roman, letter size 10.

Conference papers will be published in **IRDO Proceedings** on CD, abstracts in hard copies (with CIP, ISBN/ISSN), as a book in the IRDO's series 'Družbena odgovornost / Social responsibility'.

5. Selection of submitted contributions:

Abstracts and papers will be accepted or refused after a double blind review. Accepted papers will be sorted in three groups:

- A. Papers with 20 min oral presentation with power-point and 10 min discussion;
- B. Workshops with discussion of 25 minutes after 5 minutes introduction.
- C. Posters for group discussion in breaks.

6. Methods, used at conference:

We will give priority to discussions and limit the number of traditional lectures. The Open Space Method will also be used. Official language at the Conference is English and Slovene; it is the authors' free choice (in agreement with the present audience).

- 10 December 2012 information about acceptance; new deadline: 25th December 2012
- **10 January 2013** final papers in English; new deadline: **25th January 2013**

- 7, 8, 9 March 2013– Conference in Maribor, Slovenia.

The conference fee for non-authors is 190.00 EUR + VAT.

The conference fee for authors of accepted contributions will be reduced to 75% of Conference fee (from 190.00 EUR to 142.50 EUR + VAT). Doctoral students (authors of Papers), non-profit organizations (authors of Papers) and IRDO Institute members have 50% discount on conference fee (from 190.00 EUR to 95.00 EUR + VAT).
