Challenge

Two multidisciplinary conferences have been previously organized by UNESCO Chair « Culture and Wine Traditions» of the University of Bourgogne initiated by Pr. Norbert Latruffe : one in Beaune (Burgundy), in 2008 on « Wine and Health » the other, in 2016, in Hyères (Provence), « Wine, nutrition, health ». Both of them have shown the richness and the large diversity of viticultural, enological and nutritional practices according to the geographic area, cultural heritages transmitted along history. This multidisciplinary international conference on « **Vine, wine, food and health** » will take place in Heraklion from **may 23 to mai 26 2018 (opening on may 22 in the afternoon)** with the aim to put in perspective the cultural, technical, economic, environmental and sanitary aspects of the vitiviniculture and the diet of european countries, with a peculiar focus to the Mediterranean area. One of the major goal is to illustrate the diversity of cultural, vitivinicole and nutritional practices linked to the traditions and the identity of different countries.

The *Mediterranean diet*, is on the Unesco list of Intangible Cultural Heritage since 2010, known for his beneficial effects on health and longevity. The location of the conference at Heraklion, in the center of the Mediterranean civilization is particularly pertinent where the tradition of vine, wine and local cuisine rich in fruits, veggies, oil olive, with a limited meat consumption is multimillennar, and so called as *Cretan diet*.

This international and multidisciplinary conference is organized by the UNESCO Chair « Culture and Wine Traditions» of the University of Bourgogne and the University of Crete (Heraklion and Rethymnon campus), in partnership with the region of Crete, the city of Heraklion, the National Federation of Greek Wines (EDOAO), the association Mediterranean Nutrition and Health (NMS) and the ELGO-Dimitra.

The program shall include technical visits in wineries and vineyards, notably olive trees fields, and one trip to discover archaeological, historical and landscape richness's of the island of Crete.

International lecturers from numerous disciplines, of vine, wine and nutrition, particularly linked to Mediterranean area, shall bring, using geographical examples, crossed views on the main subjects proposed on different sessions: terroirs and wine territories; wine and health ; food and Mediterranean nutrition, particularly the Cretan diet ; wine, gastronomy, tourism and development.

PROPOSED THEMAS

- Vineyards and *terroirs*: grape varieties, enological processes, evolution, rules, market and trade, knowledge and technical spreading up, viticultural and enological actors.
- Cultural and heritage aspects of vine, wine and diet.
- Wine, Mediterranean and Cretan diets and health.
- Wine, gastronomy, tourism, and development: economical development, plates and wines association, architecture, folklore, strategies...

Based on various examples the aims of this conference is to compare strategies of heritage and development in old vineyards territories with news area of wine production

Keys words: vine, wine, diet, health, culture, heritage, vineyards, tourism, viticultural and enological sciences and techniques, Mediterranean particularities, Crete.

Presentation of communication proposal:

- Title of the communication
- 1 summary of 1000 words maximum
- Information to the authors (last name, First name, Institution, e-mail, and postal address)
- 4 keywords maximum
- Abstracts submitted after **15 December 2017** will not be accepted

Evaluation criteria of abstracts shall be the following:

- Clarity of the proposed topic
- Link with theme of the colloquium
- Scientific Interest and/or originality of the approach in regard of the scientific literature already existing
- Straightness and coherence of the rational and/or the experimental used protocols.

Abstract submission will close on December 15th, 2017.

The organizing committee will provide information upon acceptance as well as on the type of presentation during January 2018.

The non-selected propositions submitted for an oral communication may be possibly to be presented as poster with the following format: width: 80 cm; height: 100 cm
