Proposed Project Name	Advancing Professional Support Services for Academics in Georgia (PASSAGE)
Specific objectives	The overall objective of the project is to strengthen faculty support and development programs to improve teaching and learning. Furthermore, the project aims to establish leaders (academic developers) in teaching and learning to lead these efforts. The project PASSAGE envisions initiating and implementing academic development contributing to the changing environment in Georgian HEI, to streamline their capacities towards European HIE area. The activity intends to improve professional (both academic and managerial) capacities of Georgian academics developing and implementing professional support services by introducing academic developers at Georgian Higher Education institutions. Academic developers play a humongous role in encouraging professional practices, personal knowledge, organizational development, stimulating and facilitating change and team building in higher education institutions. Thus, the HEIs in Georgia will be able to ensure enhancement of professional skills of professors, retention of qualified staff and transition towards student oriented learning. Furthermore, it will ultimately increase the involvement of faculty members in decision-making processes at their respective HEIs. The project targets teachers/researchers at an early stage of their career (including PhD students) to provide them with relevant programs, competencies, knowledge and mentoring on various issues necessary for their induction in a professional field. Also, the project intends to provide experienced and qualified professors/researchers with coherent, high quality education opportunities to ensure that their qualifications and skills are upgraded according to the needs and requirements of the global higher education area.
