The History of Ternopil Volodymyr Hnatiuk National Pedagogical University

- 1620 — The brotherhood training teachers school was established in Kremenets.
- 1637 — The brotherhood school was reorganized into Kremenets-Bohoyavlen'sk college.
- 2nd half of the XVII cent. — a Jesuit college (training teachers for Jesuit schools) was founded on the basis of Kremenets-Bohoyavlen'sk college.
- 1773 — The Jesuit college in Kremenets was closed.
- 1783 — Subdistrict and district secular schools, the latter training teachers, were located in the college building.
- 1805 — The higher educational institution, Volyn higher school of higher sciences, was founded on the foundation of the college building.
- 1818 — Volyn higher school was reorganized into Kremenets-Volyn lyceum.
- 1833 — Kremenets-Volyn lyceum was closed. Volyn theological college was established in its place.
- 1902 — Volyn eparchy girl's college, which trained teachers for junior pupils was founded on the basis of Volyn theological college.
- 1920 — Kremenets lyceum was reestablished. Teachers college affiliated with the lyceum was opened.
- 1935 — The teachers college was restructured into the Pedagogium.
- 1937 — Pedagogical lyceum was founded. In 1939 twenty educational institutions were established.
- 1940 — The Teachers Training institute was opened on the basis of the former lyceum. For the first time courses were conducted in Ukrainian language.
- 1942-1944 — During the Great Patriotic War teachers and students changed the class-rooms and books into trenches and rifles.
- 1944 — Kremenets institute was again opened for students in September.
- 1950 — In accordance with the resolution of the Council of Ministry of Ukraine of the fourth of August Kremenets teachers training institute was reorganized into the pedagogical institute.
- 1969 — The Pedagogical institute was transferred to the city of Ternopil.
- 1997 — The Pedagogical University was established on the basis of Ternopil Pedagogical Institute.
- 2004 — In accordance with the decree of the president of Ukraine of the 21st of August 2004 the University received the status of National Educational Institution.

Educational process

About 8000 students study at thirteen departments of the University.

524 university teachers are engaged in the educational process. Among them are:
157 Doctors of Sciences, Professors;
236 Candidates of Sciences, Assistant Professors.

The training facilities include: 7 University buildings, 35 computer laboratories, 40 specialized laboratories, a library containing more than 630,000 documents, a sports and fitness complex, a stadium, recreation centres located on the banks of the Dnister river and in the forest reserve "Medobory". The students live in 5 dormitories. There are also 2 dining halls, an Internet cafe, a recreation centre and a sanatorium-preventorium.



Research work

University research is conducted in five priority areas of science and technological development.

A number of *scientific schools* have emerged at the University, conducting research in:

1. Psychological and pedagogical fundamentals of the premarital education of the youth.
2. Didactic fundamentals of general technical training of pupils and students.
3. Ukrainian literature genre system.
4. Problems of receptive poetics, narratology and translatology in Ukrainian and foreign literary relations.
5. Theory and methods of physical training.
6. Ecological biochemistry and ecotoxicology.



There are two specialized Academic Councils at the University. The Doctoral Academic Council has the authority for the defence of doctoral and candidate theses. The Permanent Postgraduate School offers 29 Candidate's Degree Programs and Institution of Doctoral Candidacy – 5 Doctor's Degree Programs. The University has its own Publishing House.

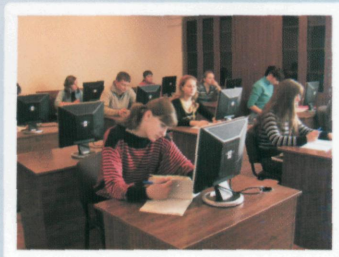
Educational work

Students' scientific work

An integral part of the educational process of the University is the students' scientific work, which is realized in the following ways: the students participate in the work of scientific study groups, research groups, scientific seminars held by the departments and leading scientific schools they also take part in subject contests (Olympiads) and scientific conferences. Two student-organized scientific journals "Magistr" (Master) and "Studentskyi Naukovyi Visnyk" (Students' Scientific Bulletin) are published at the University.

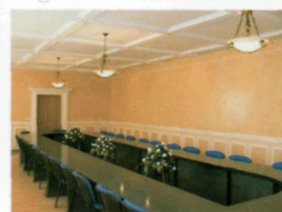

The faculty of the postgraduate education provides the opportunity to acquire new specialties and heightened qualification on the basis of already received degrees; it serves to improve of universities employees' professional skills.

PREPARATORY DEPARTMENT

Preparatory faculty provides general knowledge of University entrants, introductory pedagogical training, trains prospective students for entering the University.

International students



Follows is a list of admission requirements necessary for entering Bachelor's and Master's degrees:

1. An application form of the University;
2. An original certificate of secondary or higher education (or its attested copy) with the list of the subjects studied and marks received, its translation into Ukrainian or Russian, attested by the translator at the Embassy of Ukraine and legalized at the Embassy of Ukraine in accordance with established procedure;
3. A certificate of health, in particular confirming absence of HIV-infection, attested by the official health service body of the home country and received not earlier than 2 months before his/her arrival in Ukraine, its translation into Ukrainian or Russian, attested by a translator at the Embassy of Ukraine and legalized at the Embassy of Ukraine in accordance with established procedure;
4. An original (or an attested copy) of a certificate of birth, its translation into Ukrainian or Russian, attested by a translator at the Embassy of Ukraine and legalized at the Embassy of Ukraine in accordance with established procedure;
5. A valid national passport produced in person;
6. 6 passport photographs (4X6 cm);
7. A return ticket to the mother country with an open date of departure valid for one year.

The period of studies:

- 4 years – Bachelor's degree
- 5 years – Master's degree

The tuition fee

The tuition fee for students per year is: \$2000 USD

(includes teaching, the use of the university library and sports facilities.

However, the tuition fee does not include catering, medical care and medical insurance, document processing or any other expenses)

The hostel accommodation: \$400 USD per year

The language of teaching: Ukrainian

The foreign students can have only full-time program

Studies for the III degree (Doctorate) are carried out in 15 specialities

The period of studies: 3 years

The tuition fee for post-graduate training: 3000 \$USD

Ternopil



Ternopil is a city in Western Ukraine, politico-administrative, economic-business and cultural center of the Ternopil region. Key automobile and railway lines intersect in Ternopil.

Ternopil is one of few cities in the world, which hosts a large lake in its center. It is surrounded with several parks at once. The Ternopil Lake is city symbol. If the other Western Ukrainian cities are proud of their rich architectural heritage only, the pride of Ternopil is its blue pool as well.
